## DISCHARGE INSTRUCTIONS following SCROTAL SURGERY



### **Activity**

- Avoid heavy lifting (over 10 pounds) for 2 weeks.
- Avoid sexual activity for 2 weeks.
- Your doctor will advise you when it's time to return to work.

### **Incision and Dressing Care**

- If you have a dressing, it may be removed in five days.
- Keep your incision clean and dry.
- You may sponge bath only for three to four days postop. Pat the incision dry afterwards. No showers or tub baths.

### What to Watch For

- BLEEDING: You may have a small amount of dark red or brownish red drainage from the incision for a few hours after surgery. If this continues or becomes bright red, you must contact your doctor.
- BLEEDING UNDER THE SKIN: You may have bleeding which collects under the skin. This looks like dark blueish swelling. If this happens, you must contact your doctor.
- SWELLING: It is normal to have some swelling. Apply a covered ice pack every two hours for 20 minutes to help reduce swelling. Your doctor will advise you if you should wear a scrotal support.
- ❖ INFECTION: check for signs of infection: fever and/or chills (38°C or 100°F), redness, warmer than normal to touch, increased swelling, increased pain, and/or foul drainage. If any of these occur, you must contact your doctor.
- PAIN: Your doctor will advise you what medications to use. Ice packs applied as above will also help relieve discomfort.

### If you have been given anesthesia or sedation

- Do not drive or operate machinery for 24 hours.
- Do not make important decisions or sign any important documents in the next 24 hours. Do not plan any activities that require complex thought or coordination for 24 hours.
- Do not consume alcohol, tranquilizers or sleeping medications for the next 24 hours.
- Sedative and narcotic medicines given during a surgical procedure may linger for hours. You may feel dizzy for several hours after your procedure.
- ❖ You must have a responsible adult stay with you tonight.

## Go to an Emergency Department if any of the following occurs:

- Persistent nausea or vomiting not relieved by over-thecounter medications
- Persistent pain, not relieved by prescribed medications
- Redness, swelling, or drainage of pus from the incision
- ❖ Fever and/or chills (38°C or 100°F)
- Bladder difficulties
