DISCHARGE INSTRUCTIONS FOR A MINOR PROCEDURE



- 1. Unless otherwise instructed, resume your usual diet today. If nauseated, stay on clear fluids until the feeling passes.
- 2. Increase your intake of fluid and fiber to avoid constipation. Laxatives may be used for constipation, but please discuss with your surgeon first.
- 3. You may shower or bathe. If showering, avoid saturating the incision with water and gently pat it dry afterwards. Avoid soaps, powders, and lotions. If you have a drain in place, keep dressing completely dry.
- 4. Restrict your activity and rest for the remainder of the day. Resume normal activity as tolerated and as directed on the days following your procedure.
- 5. Resume medications as before your procedure unless otherwise advised.
- 6. Take your prescribed pain medication as directed for discomfort.
- 7. Your physician will advise you when you can return to work.
- 8. If you have had a breast biopsy today, resume normal arm activity tomorrow.

If you have been given anesthesia or sedation:

- Do not drive or operate machinery for 24 hours.
- Do not make important decisions or sign any important documents in the next 24 hours. Do not plan any activities that require complex thought or coordination for 24 hours.
- Do not consume alcohol, tranquilizers or sleeping medications for the next 24 hours.
- Sedative and narcotic medicines given during a surgical procedure may linger for hours. You may feel dizzy for several hours afterwards.
- You must have a responsible adult stay with you tonight at home.

Go to an Emergency Department if any of the following occurs:

- Persistent nausea or vomiting not relieved by over-thecounter medications.
- Persistent pain not relieved by prescribed medications.
- Redness, swelling or drainage of pus from incision
- ✤ Fever and/or chills (38°C or 100°F)
- Unusual cough or shortness of breath
- If you have a drain in place, your doctor will advise you when to make arrangements for removal.
- If you had a biopsy, consider bringing a care partner with you to your follow up appointment.
