## **DISCHARGE INSTRUCTIONS FOR BOWEL** RESECTION

- Consume a diet high in protein to promote healing (if able to). If you feel uncomfortable, stay on clear fluids until the feeling passes. If nauseated, avoid milk products until settled.
- 2. Increase the fluid and fiber in your diet to help you bowels move.
- 3. Increase intake of fluid and fiber to avoid constipation. Laxatives may be used for constipation but please discuss with your surgeon first.
- 4. Restrict your activity and rest for the remainder of the day. Resume normal activity as tolerated and as directed on the days following your procedure.
- 5. Do not lift anything heavier than 10 pounds (6 kg) for 6 weeks or as otherwise directed by your physician.
- Avoid having a bath until steri-strips or staples are removed. You may shower. When showering, avoid saturating the incision with water while steri-strips are in place. Pat the incision dry. Avoid using soaps, powders and lotions.
- 7. If you require dressing changes for your wound, please ask the staff about resources and assistance that may be available (e.g. Home Care, Ambulatory Day Clinic)
- 8. Resume medications as before your procedure unless otherwise advised. Take your prescribed pain medication as directed for discomfort.
- 9. Your physician will advise you when you may return to work.
- 10. If you have steri-strips along your incision, make arrangements to have them removed in one (1) week.

## 12. If you have been given anesthesia or sedation;

- Do not drive or operate machinery for 24 hours.
- Do not make important decisions or sign any important documents in the next 24 hours. Do not plan any activities that require complex thought or coordination for 24 hours.
- Do not consume alcohol, tranquilizers or sleeping medications for the next 24 hours.
- Sedative and narcotic medicines given during a surgical procedure may linger for hours. You may feel dizzy for several hours afterwards.
- You must have an adult with you tonight at home.
- 13. Notify your doctor or come to Emergency if any of the following occur:
  - Persistent pain not relieved by prescribed pain medication.
  - Persistent vomiting not relieved by over the counter medications.
  - Unusual bleeding from your incision or rectum
  - Redness, swelling or drainage of pus from incision
  - Fever and/or chills (38°C or 100°F)
  - Bladder difficulties
  - Unusual cough or shortness of breath
  - Severe abdominal bloating or tenderness
  - Bowels have not moved for \_\_\_\_\_ days
